GRANT LYMAN IS INJURED

YOUNG MACHINIST HELPER IS PINCHED BY ENGINES

Taken to hospital and reported resting well today

When machinist's helper Grant Lyman attempted to board No. 415, shortly after nine o'clock last night he was caught between the cab of the moving engine and the tank of No. 452 and quite severely crushed about the chest.

It seems that No. 415 was going into the round house in charge of a hostler, and the tank of the big "Molly" was standing on one of the short tracks at her side, leaving very little space for the engines to clear. Lyman was taken on a stretcher to the Grande Ronde hospital last night immediately after the accident, where he was attended by Dr. Hall, of the company physicians.

It is not thought he will suffer any permanent injury on account of the accident, although he is quite badly bruised when taken to the hospital last night, and it was feared that he was injured internally.

He is reported as doing nicely this morning.
