**Motor Car for Pendleton Run.**  
(Pendleton, E. O.)

That a motor car service is to be established at once between Umatilla and Pendleton is announced by J. H. O'Neill, traveling passenger agent for the O. R. & N. company. It is the intention of the company, according to Mr. O'Neill to place the car in operation within a few days. The exact date for starting the service has not been set, but it will probably commence on Monday. The car for use on the run is now en route from Kansas City.

The exact schedule for the car is not yet worked out. However it will probably leave Umatilla at 8:30 a. m., and returning westward will leave Pendleton at 4 or 4:30 p. m. But one trip each way will be made during the day. The present charge of three cents per mile for passenger travel will also apply on the motor car.

That the passenger service between Umatilla and Pendleton should be improved by the addition of a morning service from the west end has long been desired by local people. Consequently business men are rejoicing over the announcement regarding the motor car. After the car has been placed upon the run, a morning an evening passenger service will be provided both ways between Umatilla and Pendleton. The motor car will not effect the schedule of any of the present trains.

**CREW EXONERATED**

Investigation finds Henson and O' have not to blame

Durkee, March 23—Report of board of inquiry concerning derailment of First No. 5, near MP 386 1-2 March 19, 1910:

First No. 5, conductor O'Hare, Engineer Henson, engine 305, consisting of one baggage car, one dining car and four sleepers was derailed near MP 386 1-2 March 19, 1910, damaging engine to the extent of \$1500, baggage car, OSL 650, \$500, track \$50 and contents \$100.

Derailement was caused by gravel washing onto track caused by a cloudburst in the mountains, several miles northeast of the track. Train was running at a speed of about 25 miles per hour.

We find this accident was unavoidable as from the evidence train reached point of derailment soon after gravel commenced to wash on track, and this wash continued for some time after the derailment occurred.

**NARY MEN EMPLOYED**

Constructing railroads into Eastern Oregon

Portland, March 23.—John R. Stevens, president of the Oregon coast railway, now under construction by the Donohue class in Eastern Oregon, says ORO men are at work on the 500 miles long water tunnel or nearly as many miles as waterway employed on the construction of the 370 miles of the coast line road. He says the new line is of the most modern construction and the whole thing is being pushed with the utmost possible energy. The present plan is to build south only as far as Bend, although maps have been filed south to the Klamath Indian Reservation.
