NAB GANG OF SUSPECTS

FIVE MEN ACCUSED OF ROBBING HAISTEN STORE

Arrested at Nampa and brought to La Grande for trial today

Five men charged with having broken into the second hand store of F. D. Haisten on Fir Street on March 11th, were brought to La Grande this morning by Night Officer J. H. MacLaughlin, who yesterday went to Nampa to fetch the prisoners, who, on warrants sworn out here by Mr. Haisten, were arrested by Nampa officers. The burglary took place on March 11th, when the store was ransacked, the safe "touched" and articles valued at \$200 or more, were taken from the store. Local police officials notified surrounding towns, giving outside officials the numbers of the stolen watches and guns. The first discovery of the suspects was at Nampa where Haisten's watches were held for sale. Mr. Haisten, the loser, accompanied MacLaughlin to Nampa yesterday and identified the goods on the persons of the prisoners as his property.

Immediately after their return to La Grande today, the men were arraigned before Justice Williams, where they waived examination and were bound over to the grand jury. It appears the evidence against them is strong and they are apparently in grave danger of conviction. One of the men is a mere boy, apparently of good parentage and gives the impression of having been a tramp for the "fun of the thing."

The others are older men and some of them bear the earmarks of well-seasoned men of the road. They gave their names before Justice A. C. Williams today as John V. Wright, George Lang, James Wilson, Daniel Conley and John Williams. It is probable that a special session of the grand jury will be held in order, if possible, to hear the case during the present term of court.
