LACK OF FIRE ESCAPES

ANOTHER SCANDAL ABOUT TO BE DEVELOPED

Fire Chief says owners were notified to provide escapes

Chicago, March 26.—A thorough search of the ruins of the building of Fish & Company today failed to reveal more bodies and it is believed that the 12 victims whose bodies have been recovered, are all who perished in yesterday's fire. It is believed that none would have been killed had the building been equipped with fire escapes.

Fire Chief Horan said today that he had notified the building department some time ago that the Fish building was unsafe and should have fire escapes. The officials of the building department assert no such notification had been received. As the outgrowth of the fire, indications are that another scandal will develop in which the building department will be involved.

ROOSEVELT RECEIVES AMERICAN

Calo, March 26.—Roosevelt was an honored guest at a great reception in the terrace garden of the Sheppard Hotel today. Seven hundred Americans greeted the former president. After the reception at the hotel he visited the Ashar University. He was attended only by two Mohammedans. From the University he hurried to the Abdin Palace, where he lunched with the Khedive. Ambassador Strauss was also a guest.
