HIS HEART DISLOCATED

ELLIS WHITMAN GIVES SEVERAL RAT EXHIBITIONS

Among other things, heart drops about 4 inches and beats.

Dislocation of the human heart—a phenomenon that is very rare—was witnessed in La Grande last night and this morning, by various physicians and individuals, and at noon by two physicians, an attorney and two newspaper men when Ellis Whitman, the human rattlebox, gave an exhibition in the office of Dr. C. H. Upton. Dislocation of practically all the joints in his body was also done and resetting effected voluntarily, which is in itself a rarity, according to the leading physicians in the business, but not so infrequent, however, as his dislocation of the heart.

With five eyes the performance closely, Whitman at noon dislocated



Ellis Whitman "Human Rattlebox" his heart twice. Both times, physicians pronounced it real. The heart apparently drops about four or five inches downward from its normal position and is voluntarily returned to the correct position.

That Whitman is not a fake is attested by many local physicians.

Doctors Hubbard and Upton saw the noon exhibition and pronounced it a fact and the following letters from two others speak for themselves:

La Grande, Oregon, March 30, 1910
To whom it may concern—"After having read the articles in the morning and evening papers, I have had an opportunity of making an examination of the ability of Elias Whitman better known as the Human Rattlebox and I want to say that without the actual rupture of the Capsules of the Joints he is able to produce Dislocation of a great many of the Joints of his body.

MANY ROOSEVELTS

Society organized in Paris opposed to slaughter of elephants

Paris, March 30.—"Elephant's Friends" is the name of a new society organized here for the purpose of checking the wanton slaughter of elephants in Africa and Asia. The formation of the society on the eve of Roosevelt's entry into Paris from his African hunt is causing comment. The society believes the elephant is threatened with extinction unless some action is taken to prevent it. Secretary Tournier declares that "Roosevelts great and small" take pleasure in exterminating average of 40,000 elephants every year.

Budapest, March 30.—A crowd of peasants are today searching for the youth who is accused of having set fire to the dance hall at Ockerito Sunday night, in which nearly 400 perished. It is reported the young man has been seen hiding near the town. If captured he will be lynched.

Taft in a Mob

Washington, March 30.—Taft was in danger today of being mobbed by 2000 men, women and children who broke through police lines and stormed the executive office. The police finally restored order. Several women fainted in the crush which was so great that certain dignified statesmen who had called on Taft were compelled to leave through rear windows. The crowd was composed mostly of high school students and teachers of New England who had assembled to shake the president's hand. When order was restored the president shook hands with 1800 of the visitors.
