**PRES. TAFT IS RECKLISS**

New York, March 31—The four chauffeurs who drive the automobile for President Taft are quoted today as saying that the president is certain to figure in an auto smash-up in which he is liable to be injured unless he orders them to travel slow. Taft has been repeatedly warned that his orders to "move faster" are liable to result in a wreck. A collision with a trolley car was narrowly averted here Tuesday while the president was on his way to the station.

**Nevada Executive on War Path**  
 Carson City, March 31.—An action to compel Governor Dickinson to accept \$400,000 worth of repudiated bonds of North Carolina in behalf of the state of Nevada is being argued before the state supreme court today. The Governor refused to accept the bonds as a gift to the state. This resulted in a suit to compel him to do so. The bonds are said to be valueless.

**Will Rush Murder Case**  
 New York, March 31—That the case of Albert Wolter, charged with the murder of Ruth Wheeler, whose mutilated body was found in his apartments, will be rushed was indicated today when Judge Malqueen refused the ten day's delay asked by the defense. The prisoner will be arraigned tomorrow and the trial date set. It is expected the trial will be commenced within two weeks.

**SERVICES VERY SIMPLE**

Washington, March 31.—In accordance with his wish the funeral today of David J. Brewer, associate justice of the supreme court was simple. The men who occupied the bench with Brewer were elected as honorary pall bearers. The president and members of the senate and house committees on the judiciary attended. Late today the body will be taken to Leavenworth, Kansas, for interment.
