## CIRCUIT COURT IS ADJOURNED

SESSION FOR 22 DAYS AND TRY 14 CASES.

Eight sessions go far toward hurrying completion of work.

In session 22 days and trying 14 cases—a remarkable number in length of time—the March term of the circuit court adjourned last night. All jurors but those living in Grande were excused. The juror from this city may be called at any time again, in case there be a trial of the alleged store robbers who were nabbed at Nampa recently for breaking into the Halsten store here. Eight sessions of court were held almost continually during these 22 days. In this way the court was able to keep the wheels of justice grinding without unnecessary delay and the number of cases handled in the 22 days, demonstrates what the eight sessions did toward expediting matters.
