Eight or ten years hence not a few of the residents of this county will wonder why they did not get into the fruit business when they could get lands at a reasonable price. We do not know the value of Grande Ronde valley soil. The stranger will own it all during the next few years simply because he is the one who will pay the price, after touring the country for values. Many are of the opinion that the apple business will soon be overdone. This conclusion is not based on actual conditions. The facts are, we are not growing the quantity of apples we did ten years ago, and the population of the United States is constantly increasing. Again, there is a price question that may be solved somewhat. There is a nice margin in growing apples under commercial conditions at 75c to \$1.00 a box. Freight may become lower and should, and when the consumer can purchase nice, bright, red, juicy apples at \$1.50 per box, the consumption will be enormous.

MONDAY LAST DAY FOR TAXES

Taxes must be paid by that time or penalty is attached.

Next Monday is the last day of grace for unpaid taxes. After this date, April 4th, if one half of the amount due is not paid, a ten per cent penalty is added and the delinquent sum draws interest at the rate of one per cent per month until paid. If one half of the tax is paid the payment of the balance can be deferred until the first Monday in October without penalty.
