#### FISHING SEASON OPENS

"All Fool's Day" marked the opening of the trout season.

There is said to be no sentiment in the law, but it seems that there is a slight sentiment of humor in the law that would open the trout fishing season on the first of April, sending the ardent followers of Sir Isaac forth to be fooled by the wily Oregon crawfish and the sportive "bull head," and the wise old trout who examines the luring bait from every angle, like a lady buying a hat, and then decides not to bite today.

Those who would engage in the sport must provide themselves with a license issued by the County Clerk, and bear in mind certain points of the law, copies of which appear on the backs of the permits for ready reference.

It should be remembered that the season is from April first to November first, except in the lakes of Baker county, where the open season is from July 1st to Oct 1st; that it is unlawful to fish at night; to fish in the Rogue river or its tributaries; to take trout, salmon trout or bass except with hook or line; to take char or salmon less than six inches in length; to sell trout except those raised in private hatches under the direction of the State Game Warden; to fish without a license; to cast sawdust, shavings, or wood waste into any Oregon stream; and to use gas, powder or any explosive or poison for the purpose of taking fish.
