

PARKER GETS PARDON

Word was received late last night that Governor Benson had issued a pardon to Frank Parker the young man who was convicted of burglary last spring, when he was jointly accused with Orley Chandler.

Since his conviction Parker has been at the state penitentiary, being brought from there recently to testify in the case of Chandler, charged by the State with having perjured himself at the trial last spring.

It was largely Parker's testimony that convicted Chandler, who received a three year's sentence yesterday morning. Parker was in the county jail when word was received by the local authorities that he had been pardoned, and that they were to release him.

He was given his liberty by Sheriff Childers immediately upon receipt of the order for his release, which came late yesterday afternoon.
