**LIBERAL SUBSCRIPTIONS TO REMOVE ALL DEBT**

Tabernacle association now out of debt and on safe side.

Approximately \$1600 were raised by public subscription during the meetings at the tabernacle yesterday. About \$1300 were subscribed at the midday meeting and at night sufficient was raised to clear the tabernacle association of all indebtedness.

In rough figures the expenses for the construction of the building and other expenses figure more than \$2000 and the large sum subscribed yesterday cleans up the remaining indebtedness.

**Angered by Release.**

Manila, April 4.—Much indignation has been aroused at the release of the two Japanese who were arrested here a few days ago on the charge of being spies. The Japs were given their liberty on cable instructions from Washington. Owing to the fact that there is no provision in the Philippine military code governing a trial of spies of a nation not in war with this country the alleged spies were turned over to the civil authorities. The civil laws likewise showed that the statutes were inadequate to punish them with the result that they were released.

Purcell went home to Everett to get over the shock of the slide at Wellington. There he went to the theater one night about the middle of March and also sustained another shock.
