**TEACHER ON THE STREETS.**

Aged fellow entertains and instructs large audience on street

Long curly locks dangling over his shoulders, hoary headed, his face whiskered and in many ways carrying the insignia of the historic teacher and philosopher, a strange old man has been today entertaining and instructing a large audience at the corner of Adams and Depot. He is a phenologist, or some sort of a "seer" which is immaterial, but he does talk with the tongue of a teacher and the words of a philosopher. His wonderful voice makes his curt proverbs more readily understood, and many spent hours listening to his discussions. He is evidently a scholar, for his statements and conversation brand him as such, and that he has a wonderfully shaped head is another self evident fact. He claims to have the greatest development of the skull of any known man today. His terse, sharp and pointed statements reminds one of the logic of Socrates.

**MERE BOY IS PRISON BOUND**

The five men accused of robbing Halsten's store early in March were arraigned to plead to the charge of burglary not in a residence before Judge Knowles this morning at 10 o'clock.

They all plead not guilty with the exception of John W. Wright, the oldest man of the party who looks like a seasoned "yegg man," and has, it is thought, been arraigned in the courts before.

Wright received a two years sentence, which is the minimum for this offense and will be taken to Salem with Chandler by the sheriff tonight. After the men had been remanded back to the custody of the sheriff, the youngest of the quintette, John Williams, decided to change his plea and enter a plea of guilty. He was therefore brought back to the court room and came haltingly before the Judge where he told in a few words how he waited in the railroad yards while the other fellows of the gang did the job. He is but 19 years old

and has the appearance of a youth who is taking a hobo trip for pleasure rather than necessity.

It was hard for him to speak before the judge, and he listened quietly while the court gave him a little talk and some good advice, and when the sentence of two years in the penitentiary was pronounced upon him it brought tears to his eyes.

Because of his good appearance, and his age, and considering that he was no more than an accomplice, the court was inclined to be lenient with him, but the judge explained that the lightest sentence he could pronounce was the one given him, and added that if the young man was a model prisoner it might be possible to secure the recommendation of the court and perhaps of the district attorney for a pardon later on. The case of young Williams is only another of the many examples of a young man led astray by bad companions, with which the court records everywhere abound.

He stated that his father and mother were both living in Ohio, that they did not know where he was or what he was doing, or that he had been arrested and plead guilty to a felony.

He will be taken along with Chandler and Wright to the penitentiary at Salem by Sheriff Childers tonight.
