### SEATTLE MEN SEE VIRTUES

SING PRAISES AND DO MUCH TO BRING DEVELOPMENT.

D. Zimmerle reduces adverbials by medium of work.

Changing a ranch that has for years produced hay and grain into a high class apple orchard is the work that D. Zimmerle, who spent yesterday in La Grande, is engaged in at the present. Mr. Zimmerle has associated with him several capitalists in Seattle and their company is known as the Grande Ronde Orchard company. They purchased the old Mitchell ranch, three miles from Cove and according to those who have seen the transformation, they have done considerable work toward making the tract a rival of the famous Hood River apple lands.

"I never worked so hard in all my life," said Mr. Zimmerle at the Sommer hotel last evening to a reporter for the Observer. "You see," he continued, "we had confidence in the Grande Ronde valley as a fruit section, and that confidence is increasing daily. By purchasing this 200 acres and planting it to fruit we are laying the foundation for a fortune and no mistake. This valley is bound to make many men rich by its fruit lands, and we wanted to get in on the ground floor. My associates in Seattle are pleased with the outlook and they will be more than pleased when they come down and take a look at the physical appearance of the property after I have put in a few months more. But, really, don't you know that this apple orchard work is a flesh reducer. I used to be as fat as George Good, and look at me now."

With that remark Mr. Zimmerle stood up like a soldier and sure enough, the way his clothes hung would indicate that at some time not far back he was a larger man than he is today.
