

PE WATER TO NEW PARK

CITY DISPLAYS WILLING- NESS TO AID

Asking is Sufficient to Get Or-
der for 2000 Foot Extension.

Displaying a commendable willing-
ness to aid the park association and
the chautauqua committee, every
members of the city council last even-
ing "fell to" the proposition of
extending the water mains in North
La Grande to the Riverside Park.
City water is a necessity there and
the chautauqua committee sent a del-
egation of men and women to the
council last evening to have the mat-
ter of main extension placed before
the city fathers. With promptness
and dispatch a resolution passed
which necessitates the building of
about 2470 feet of four inch mains.
The main now runs to a point with-
in 1470 feet from the city limits, and
it is 1000 feet from the city limits
to the Park. This will give city wa-
ter facilities for drinking purposes,
park purposes and fire protection to
buildings that may be constructed
there in the future. The willingness
of the council in this matter has
pleased the chautauqua committee.

tertainment of the more serious type.
It is one of the few English society
comedies that has been able to please
the American play goers, but "Cousin
Kate" pleases them in a way that
is enthusiastic and lasting, and bids
fair to remain popular until Halley's
comet comes next time.

The play was seen here some time
ago with Ethel Barrymore in the role
and all who saw it then are anxious
to see it again, while those who mis-
sed it on that occasion can make up
now for the deprivation.

REPLACEMENTS ON ADAMS

CREW NOW AT WORK SUBSTITUT-
ING 10-INCH MAINS.

Something That Will Last Being Put
Down This Week.

Removal of six-inch water mains
along Adams avenue has been com-
menced under direction of Superin-
tendent Gilman. The pipe is to be
replaced by cast steel 10-inch mains
which are intended to last perma-
nently and avert tearing up the
paving when it is once put down. The
action of the council in this matter
means that the very best obtainable
water mains will be put down along
Adams avenue before the paving is
laid.

Work has already commenced. The
crew is working in the vicinity of
Second street where the six inch wa-
ter mains start, and from there it
runs down Adams avenue to Green-
wood.

delegation representing the Califor-

made in Portugal and real sherry in
certain restricted district of Spain.
Proper labeling for the California
products will be determined by the
hearing.
