### AFTER VALUABLE INFORMATION

Enumerators Compiling Vast Amount of Information About Irrigation

Spokane, April 21.—(Special)—The census enumerators working in districts in the western, Pacific and the southwestern states, where water is supplied to fruit and farm lands by artificial means, are gathering data which will give a vast fund of valuable information to homeseekers, farmers and investors. When completed the tabulations will show the best available figures on these items:

Capital invested in private irrigation plants, character of works, acreage under the ditch, cost of planting it under water, acreage grown to irrigated crops, nature and value of the crops and the number of inhabitants in the irrigated sections.

Care has been exercised in the selection of enumerators in the irrigated districts of the several states.

Cooperation of the growers is securing all the facts available pertaining to intensive cultivation in Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado, North Dakota and South Dakota, Montana, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, California, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, Texas and New Mexico.

This is the first attempt the federal government has made to obtain statistics on private irrigation projects, and the credit for it belongs to Arthur Hooker, formerly of Spokane, now secretary of the 18th National Irrigation Congress, which is to meet at Pueblo, Colo., September 25 to 30. He started the movement a year ago before the 7th congress met in Spokane last September and enlisted Senator Hayburn of Idaho and representatives from Wyoming, Colorado, Kansas, Washington and other states. An amendment to the census act resulted early this year. While the bill was pending the census office demurred, the director saying it would be better to appoint special agents to gather the information on irrigation matters in 1911 or 1912, but he finally recommended the legislation. The bill was enacted by congress and President Taft affixed his signature in February, making it a law to become operative at the 1910 census.

### Freight Train Afire

Umatilla, April 20.—By a fire that occurred here at 1:30 this morning one car load of posts was completely destroyed and three car loads of lumber partly burned. The cars were upon a side rack and it is presumed the fire was started by a spark from the locomotive of passenger train No. 4, bound for Spokane. The cars were in the east end of the yards and when the fire was discovered the switch engine and crew hurried to the rescue. The burning cars were "cut out" and thus the fire stopped from spreading. The fire was extinguished in the lumber cars, but the car of posts could not be saved.

### QUEST MISSOURI PACKERS.

Attorney General Has Plan to Drive Trust From State Lines.

St. Louis, April 20.—Attorney general Major today announced that quo warranto proceedings would be started against the Missouri meat packers in the near future in an effort to drive them from the state.

Major says the evidence taken on Monday and Tuesday in the hearing in an effort to establish the standing of the packers convinced him they are allied with the meat trust and were operating in violation of the Missouri anti-trust laws. The attorney general will ask that their charters be broken.
