### Wood Becomes Chief of Staff

Washington, April 22.—Major General Leonard Wood, the celebrated "army doctor" of the Spanish-American war, who was first colonel of Roosevelt's regiment of "Rough Riders," today assumed his duties as chief of staff, succeeding Maj. Gen. J. Franklin Bell. Gen. Wood has been in command of the department of the east, with headquarters at New York.

Although like Maj. Gen. F. C. Ainsworth, the Adjutant General of the army, General Wood is not a West Pointer, and rose from the "medical corps," the army is beginning to forget this. Army officers in Washington generally commend his selection. Even those who have little faith in any officer who has not passed West Point say he appears to be the best available officer for the post, with the possible exception of Brig. Gen. Arthur Murray, chief of the artillery. General Murray was one of the first war department officials to wire Gen. Wood his congratulations.

"Gen. Wood is one of the best military men in the world today," said General Murray, "and I don't think there is a better man for the place. I appreciate the efforts of my friends to obtain the office for me, but I am glad Gen. Wood is to have it. I have an important work of my own here in the coast artillery and although I would have been pleased to have the honor of the higher office fallen to me, as it is, I am content to remain in my present post and endeavor to solve the big problems we have before us for the extension of the great national system of coast fortifications."

### NORTH POWDER SANATORIUM

Carlsbad Hot Springs Sanatorium to be Constructed at Once.

Active construction work will begin within the next 30 days on the Carlsbad Hot Springs Sanatorium at North Powder. At a meeting of the stockholders held last week, Dr. Edgar H. Thornton, Dr. J. K. Locke, Dr. Earnest A. Sommer, F. A. Clark, F. E. Foster and J. F. Monte were elected members of the board of directors. Mr. Clark, who has had experience as a hotel man throughout the northwest for many years, is to have charge of conducting the hotel to be erected in connection with the sanatorium, and he, with Drs. Thornton, Locke and Sommer, the medical directors, will now go over the plans with Benne & Hendricks and suggest changes required by the conditions found at the Springs.

The company which is to erect the hospital and hotel building at North Powder has now been financed to a point where immediate building is made possible. A hotel 350x175 feet will be started late this month. This building will later be enlarged by the erection of two wings, which will make the structure 620x175 feet. In these wings will be located the rooms for treatment of those who are seriously ill. The cost of the entire structure is estimated at \$250,000. The contracts will be let within a month.
