## MANY STREETS IMPROVED

SERVING NOTICES ON MANY OF THE PROPERTY OWNERS

Police Department Assigned Task of Serving the Notices.

Serving of street improvement notices is one of the tedious tasks that fall to the lot of the police department and yesterday and today Chief of Police Walden was superintending the serving of a large batch of improvement notices. Property owners

along Fourth, Fir, Pennsylvania, Third, Jefferson and others were given due notice from the city of improvements. Most of these streets are to be paved, though cement sidewalks play an important part.

## PAVING COSTS LESS HERE

GRANTS PASS PAYS CONSIDERABLY MORE THAN HERE.

Difference of 11 Cent Per Yard on Bitulithic Paving.

Compared to Grants Pass paving, in La Grande for the bitulithic sort is going to cost considerably less than the average. According to a Grants Pass paper that city is paying \$2.25 for their paving while La Grande is to pay \$2.14. Grants Pass is to pay 75 cents for its excavation per cubic yard according to a contract just closed, while La Grande will get it for 50 cents. Curbing is to cost Grant Pass 50 cents and La Grande 38 cents.

These are material figures and will reduce the cost of paving here considerably.

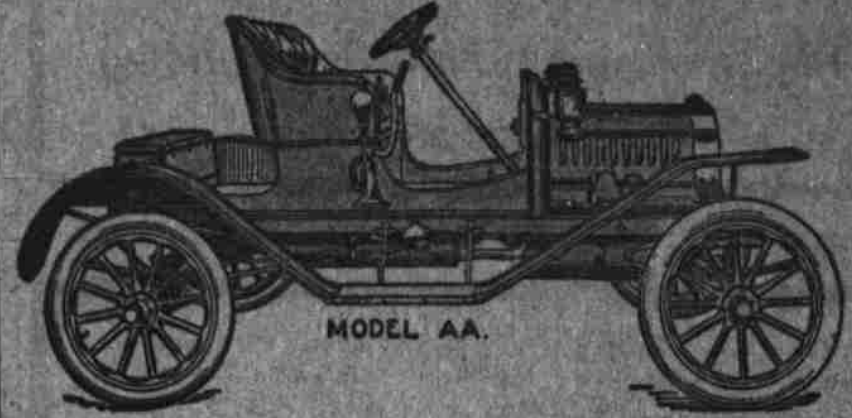

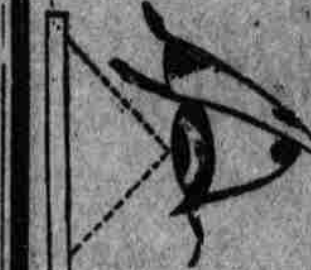
