The morning rains prevented the usual Saturday morning shopping today, but it would be impossible for anyone to pass La Grande's stores and not notice the fine line of seasonable vegetables that are piled high at an early hour at every grocery store. Hood River strawberries will be in the local markets in about 10 days.
