There has just been invented what is called the "house auto," a machine that looks something like a furniture van, with seats in front for chauffeur and passengers. At night the vehicle can quickly and easily be changed into a four room house, with beds arranged in one end like a sleeping car. At the other end is the kitchen and two rooms closed by awnings in the center. The house measures about 15 by 20 feet.

While Mrs. Carbine is pleased with the income from the Mexican ranch she still clings to the Grande Ronde as her home and will not think of ever permanently residing anywhere else.

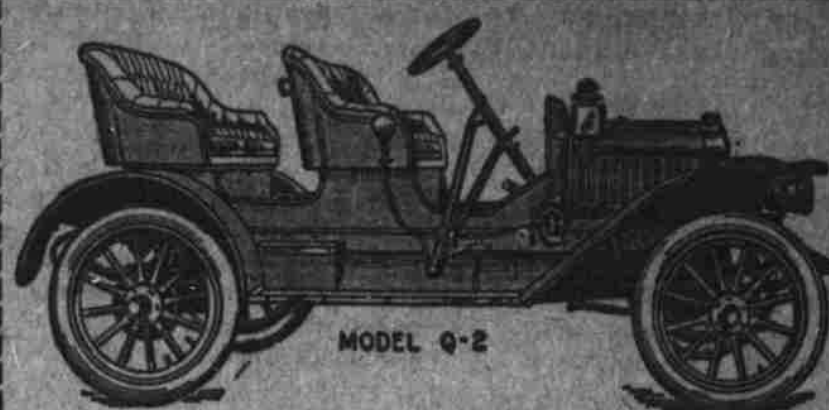
