WANDERER GROWS MUCH LARGER THIS WEEK.

So Clearcut and Large as to be Subject of Much Study

Halley's comet is proving a regular alarm clock, for this morning, at the hour of 2:30 and 3:00 the city was studied with savants who witnessed the brilliant spectacle. The comet rises about 2 a. m. and can be seen until 3 a. m., but not with the same degree of brilliancy at the last named hour. The tail extends upward at a sharp angle, and this morning measured a trifle more than the distance from the base of Mt. Fanny to the horizon above the mountain. It is clearly defined and much larger even now than Comet A. was at its most brilliant stage.

Was in La Grande Yesterday—Six Months Ahead of Schedule.

To walk 25,000 miles on a contract which if successfully done returns to him the handsome sum of \$10,000 is the deal Joseph Mikulec entered into in Austria some time ago. He spent Saturday night at the Foley hotel in La Grande and Sunday morning started on toward Salem.

Mikulec is a man of about 25 years, pleasant of manner and if he keeps up, will be a close rival of Weston, the great walker.

He is six months ahead of his schedule now and is very happy over it.

Forty-three pairs of shoes have been worn out by the young man since he started from Austria. He wore a No. 7 shoe to begin with and now he wears a No. 9. After visiting Salem, Oregon he will then go back through Montana and Dakota and on the New England where he finishes his contract.

He writes up the country through which he travels twice each week for a syndicate and carries books that contain the signatures of all governors he has met, data on different state capitals and also the signatures of Taft and Sherman. He averages 30 miles a day when he feels at his best.

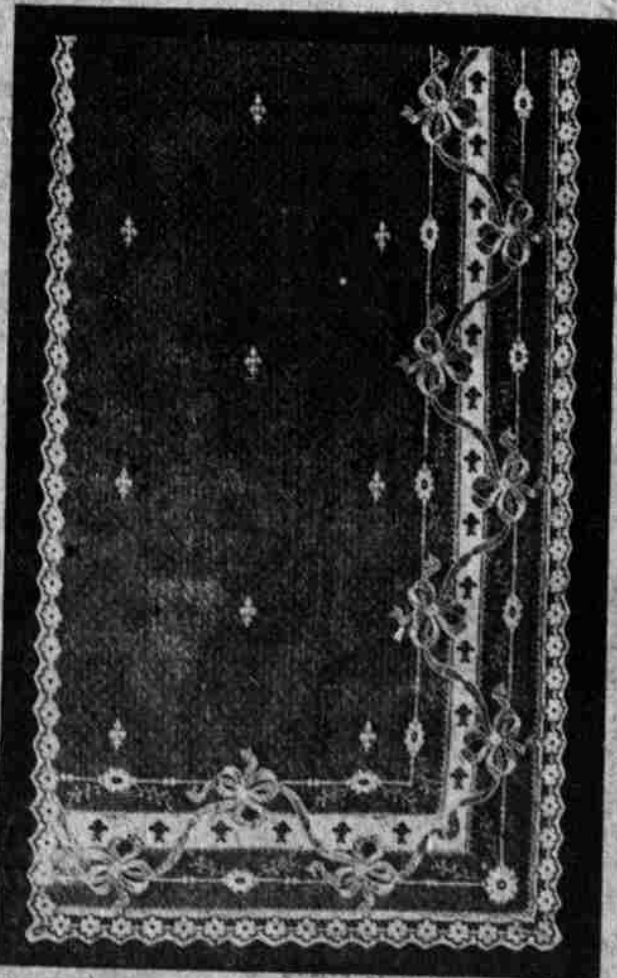
