YOUNG MAN OF 23 DIES

SON OF WELL KNOWN VALLEY PEOPLE DIES.

Was Recovering Rapidly When Sudden Hemorrhage Ends Career

An unexpected hemorrhage early this morning snuffed out the life of George Glenn Jr., aged 23, who died suddenly at the Grande Ronde hospital of a hemorrhage that followed a week in the wake of an operation for an abscess in the region of the appendix. He was recovering rapidly from the shock of the surgery, when suddenly this morning profuse bleeding started and before his attending physician, Dr. J. H. Hubbard, could be called, he died.

The deceased is the second son of Mr. and Mrs. George Glenn, who live six miles east of La Grande and who are prominent and influential members of the L. D. S. church. The funeral will be held tomorrow from the L. D. S. church at 2 o'clock.
