Over 4,000 years ago an elaborate system of filtration was established by the Egyptians to purify the waters of the Nile. In both Rome and Athens hot water was drunk in preference to cold by the small minority who used water for drinking purposes. Air Fleet For Russia.

The Russian ministry of finance has asked for bids for a fleet of flying ships of 5,500 to 8,000 cubic meters capacity. They are designed for strategic reconnaissances over distances up to 300 miles and must be capable of maintaining themselves in the air not less than ten hours at an average speed of from twenty-five to twenty-eight miles an hour.
