THOUSANDS SEE COMET.

Seen Last Night Plainly During Eclipse of the Moon.

Lick Observatory, Cal., May 24.—Halley's comet was seen by the directors of the observatory for 35 degrees of its length, during the total eclipse of the moon last night. Several photos were taken for scientific purposes.

Portland, May 24.—Thousands of people crowded to the heights last night to view the elipse of the moon. The comet was plainly visible with its long white tail spread behind it half across the skies during the moon eclipse.

Clouds here prevented a view of the tail and only occasionally was the comet itself visible.

MOORE GIVES OPINION.

Michael Ryan Convicted of Manslaughter by Supreme Court.

Salem, May 24.—The conviction of Michael Ryan of manslaughter for the killing of Henry E. Dixon in Umatilla county, was affirmed by the Supreme court. The opinion was written by Justice Moore. The shooting occurred in a grain field May, 1909.

Racers Poisoned.

Tremo, Italy May 24.—Six Italian bicycle racers are said to be dying today from poison put in their food by

rivals in a race across Italy. The stricken men were leading.

Bloodshed in Riot.

Wilkesbarre, May 24.—The first blood for the state constabulary in the miners' strike of the bituminous coal region in Western Pennsylvania occurred today. The troopers shot three men, killing one and probably fatally wounding the others. Quick action by the troops repelled rioting in the vicinity of the Pennsylvania Coal company's mines.
