PIONEER LADY CELEBRATES BIRTHDAY

MR. AND MRS. HUMPHRIES ENTERTAIN IN HER HONOR.

Lady Claims Distinction of Having a Great-great-great Grandchild.

Pioneer days were recalled with considerable vividness last evening when Mr. and Mrs. C. M. Humphreys entertained several friends in honor of "Grandma" Robbins, in honor of the 87th anniversary of her birthday. Mrs. Robbins is one of those who helped settle the west, and her advanced age is no detriment to vivid stories of frontier life as she remembers it. The host and hostess had arranged a pretty party for the occasion. Mrs. Robbins was born near Georgetown, Ky., May 26th, 1823 and in 1841 she moved to Indiana. She crossed the plains in 1852 and settled on a donation claim in Clackamas county, later moving to The Dalles. She was married in 1845 to Doctor J. A. Robbins, and he died at The Dalles in 1886.

Mrs. Robbins comes from a sturdy race. Her mother died at the age of 98 and "Grandma" is now a great, great, great grandmother, five generations being represented in the family of Mrs. N. J. Murray, of Wrights, Wash, a daughter of Grandma Robbins, the latter's daughter, Laura Webber, her son Wm. Webber, and his son Harry Webber, who is still a small child of four months, a scion of five generations.

Aside from Mrs. Murray, Grandma Robbins has two other living children of a family of seven; Mrs. I. D. Francisco of The Dalles and Mrs. J. A. Whitby of this city.

Many Grand Children Living.
Another distinction which Mrs. Robbins carries is the fact that she has thirteen grand children. In addition she has ten great grand children and one great great grandchild.

From Revolutionary Stock.
Mrs. Robbins grand father died in 1897, having served in the Revolutionary war. Her brother, John W. Hamilton, was an intrepid explorer and the town of Hamilton was named in his honor, he having settled in that section of interior Oregon.

The guests last evening were delightfully entertained with reminiscences of pioneer days and the many friends of Grandma trust that she may live many happy years yet.
