NOTICE.

Of the Establishment of an Additional Land District in the State of Oregon, and the Location of the Land Office Thereof at Vale, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given that by the act of congress, approved March 15, 1910, (Public No. 88.) it was enacted— That an additional land district is hereby created in the State of Oregon, to embrace lands described as follows: Commencing at a point where the township line between townships 11 and 12 south intersects the Snake river; thence west along said township line to its intersection with the northwest corner of township 12 south, range 36 east; thence south on the range line between ranges 35 and 36 east to its intersection with the

fourth standard parallel south; thence east on said fourth standard parallel south to its intersection with the range line between ranges 36 and 37 east; thence south along said range line to its intersection with the sixth standard parallel south; thence west along said sixth parallel south to the northwest corner of township 31 south, range 35 east; thence south along the range line between ranges 34 and 35 east to the southwest corner of township 37 south, range 35 east; thence east along the north boundary of township 38 south to the northwest corner of township 38 south, range 37 east; thence south along the range line between ranges 36 and 37 east to its intersection with the boundary line between the states of Oregon and Nevada; thence east along said boundary line to its intersection with the boundary line between the states of Oregon and Idaho; thence north and northerly along said boundary to the place of beginning; and that Vale, Malheur County, within said district, is hereby designated as the site for the land office thereof.

In pursuance of said act of congress, the land office at Vale, Oregon, will be opened for the transaction of public business on July 1, 1910, and the Registers and Receivers of the land offices at Burns and La Grande, Ore., will transact no business pertaining to the lands included within the above described boundaries after June 30, 1910.
