teristics of various breeds with ressonable allowance for age, but due regard will also be paid to heads and graceful carriage, style and general refinement that denotes breed character-points, which, while not weighing on the "scale" add a value to animals when being sold for breeding purposes, such encouraging uniformity of breed type.

All animals to be pure bred and registered with a registry association, recognized by the U. S. government, unless otherwise stated in the classification. Pure bred animals under one year need not be registered if their sire and dam are registered as above mentioned.
