PIONEER MEETING. Details of Program Being Arranged For Big Pioneer Conclave.

Secretary J. T. Williamson, aided by several other officials of the Union County Pioneer association, is making rapid headway on the matter of an interesting program for the convention which will be held in this

city on the 23rd of June. The date is one which will not materially interfere on the farmers' work on the farms, and it is believed that a record crowd will attend. A final meeting of vice presidents will be held soon to perfect all arrangements.

Depot Furniture Arrives.

The furniture for the new O. R. & N. passenger depot arrived yesterday

and will be installed at once. The furnishings will all be on the mission style. The new structure is now being connected with the telegraph and electric light wires and will be ready for occupancy in a few days. According to present plans a twelve foot concrete walk is to be constructed along each track about a third of the way to Main street and for the remainder of the distance there will be a six foot concrete walk on both sides. At the end of the 12 foot extension there will be a broad connecting walk. The space between these walks will probably be filled in with cinders so as to form ample platform room.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

Celebrate Completion.

North Yakima, Wash., June 8.—With a picnic North Yakima today celebrated the completed first unit of the government Tieton irrigation project that will irrigate 35,000 acres. The first unit will irrigate 11,000 acres, the second unit 9,000 and the third 15,000. Six tunnels were driven through the hills, 18 miles of main laterals, sixty miles of sub-laterals and 24 miles of cement pipe.

MILLIONS LOST IN FEW DAYS

Manipulation "From Outside" Cost Broker Dearly in New York.

New York, June 8.—Something over one hundred million in paper profits were made during the government's interview with railroads over the increased rates. At all street brokers and professional traders it is declared great losses were suffered by manipulation from outside. A week ago the railroad stock slumped. A semi-panic was caused by a mysterious tip that Wickersham was going to file the Hannibal bill. Railroad stock sold well and on Tuesday the market was steady and brokers bought back the stock they had thrown away when the bill was filed, at higher prices, thus getting caught both ways by the outsiders.

PRISONERS STILL AT LIBERTY

No Word or Clew of Whereabouts of Prisoners Yet Obtained here.

Though the two prisoners who escaped Friday night from the county jail have likely by this time had sufficient time to make their getaway into the hills where capture will be difficult, it is nevertheless hoped that the prisoners will be located by officials in this section of the country who have been notified.
