

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

Sell Prior's Will

London, June 9 .- Among the rare manuscripts offered for sale to-day at an auction in London is the original probate of the will of Mathew Prior. the great English post and statesman. It contains many interesting and quaint bequests.

Prior thanks Lord Harley for his "continual friendship," and hopes "he will have the same concern for my memory after death as he had for his honor while alive."

"It is very well," he adds, "that I be buried privately in Westminster Abbey, and that a monument be erected to my memory, whereon may be expressed the public employments I have bore," (sic.) He requests that the inscription be written by Dr. Robert Freind, "the buste expressed in marble." He leaves 500 lbs. "for this last mark of humane vanity."

Prior died September 18, 1721, in his fifty-eighth year, at Lord Harley's seat of Wimpople, when he was on a visit. He was buried as he desired. "at the feet of Spenser," and his monument was duly erected close to Shadwell's in the Poets' Corner of Westminster Abbey, with an epitaph by Dr. Friend.
