ABE EATON LEADS THE PROHIS

UNION PHILANTHROPIST SELECTED AS STANDARD BEARER.

John McAllister of La Grande on State Central Committee.

Abe E. Eaton, philanthropist, millionaire, woolen mill owner and prominent churchman and financier of the town of Union for many years, heads the prohibition ticket of the state for governor next fall, following a meeting in Portland last Saturday of delegates from the state to outline the action at the coming campaign. La Grande was honored by placing John McAllister on the state central committee. The full slate of officers nominated for the state ticket follows:

Badger, Ashland; N. A. Davis, Milton; A. M. Wright, Morrow county; M. D. L. French, Heppner; John McAllister, La Grande; A. E. Tully, Wallowa county, W. W. Warren, Astoria; C. V. White, Philomath; W.
