### MORE ABOUT THE EYE.

Something You Do Not Know But Should Know.

The following article is the second of a series written by Dr. M. P. Mendelsohn, doctor of optics, for the public:

Here is a strange thing about the eye, that is little understood by the general public; the eye efforts to distinct vision, can and does rob the other bodily organs of nervous energy.

What is known as "eye-strain," is often closely connected with too much disorder, and with other ailments, causing other ailments.

The overworked eye, is merely taking its toll. Nature's first purpose, seems to be, that we shall see distinctly, and if necessary she will rob Peter (the stomach) of nervous energy, to pay Paul (the eye).

But properly fitted glasses, the eye relieved of the necessity of making an extraordinary effort, no longer takes an undue share of energy and "presto" the trouble disappears.

The most common among eye difficulties, is far sightedness.

This condition, is caused by a lack of refractive power, of the organ or by the eye, being imperfectly formed that is, larger vertically, than horizontally, this trouble is the cause of numerous headaches, and nervous difficulties.

The all wise Creator, when he made man, gave him two eyes, so that in the event of an accident, to one, he might not be helpless.

But the addition of an extra eye, enormously increased the complexity of the mechanism, in order that both eyes should project a single image, upon the ground glass of this wonderful camera.

Every person, with normal eyes, on reaching an age between 40 and 50, begins to find it difficult to see small objects close to the eye.

Commonly, he concludes that he has ruined his eyes, by over indulgence in reading or by some other abuse.

He is probably mistaken, old sight is almost universal in persons of the age named, and is merely a condition where the muscles and the crystalline lens do not act as effectively as in earlier years. A pair of glasses for near vision will correct this trouble, and they should be changed every three or four years, the length of time one

pair may be worn depending upon the condition of the individual.

Many persons seem to have the idea that it is best to fight against putting on glasses, but the longer they put off wearing them the greater becomes the danger of ruining the eyes. And as Shakespeare says, "He that is stricken blind can not forget the precious eyesight lost."
