BUILDING PLANS COMPLETED

CONTRACTORS NOW WORKING ON GUILD HALL PLANS.

Building to Be Cross Shaped And Be Modern in Every Particular.

Plans and specifications for the proposed Guild hall to be erected on Fifth street at a cost of about \$30,000 are completed and are now in the hands of contractors who are figuring on the job.

The plans were drawn by Architect N. C. Gauntt. The hall is to be in the shape of a cross and will be built on the most modern styles of guild halls. The building will be a credit to the church and will add to the cash value of property on that street materially.

Preachers in Duel.

Rock Creek, Ky., June 18.—Reverend Robert Vancouver is dead and Rev. Isaac Perry is under arrest here. They fought a duel in the pulpit of their church at Rock Creek where they were associate pastors. Vancouver was struck with a knife and died instantly.

Congress to Investigate.

Washington, June 18.—Senator Lorimer's election will be investigated by congress committees on election. This was decided today. The charges will be ferreted out by the senate. Chairman Burrows fathered the resolution calling for the investigation.

Confiscates Diseased Fruit.

Fruit Inspector L. Stillwell today confiscated two crates of cherries in the local market which he found were diseased and unfit for use according to the state regulations. The crates were not stamped a thing which is essential under the law.

Charlton's Body Not Located. Como, June 18.—Divers have completed the search of the lake bottom for the body of Charlton, and it is now believed that he murdered his wife and then fled.

New York, June 18.—The body of Moses Shacks, a jewelry salesman, was found in a trunk in a hallway at an Eastside tenement today. The trunk was left by expressmen yesterday. It is believed he was robbed and murdered.
