EXPENDITURE OF \$160,000 WILL START SOON.

Definite Location of Mashine Shops ane Added Stalls Made Known.

Location of the huge machine shops which are to be built here this summer, has been agreed upon according to good authority. The new structure costing \$100,000 or thereabouts, will be erected at the east end of the present round house and extend along to the north of it. The extreme east end will be just north of the store house and will be built between the street on the north and the round house and store house on the south.

The west end of the round house is to have six or seven stalls added to it for the accommodation of the Mallets. In all the expenditures will two hours. amount to about \$170,000 it is estimated, though the appropriation is only \$160,000.
