**Wallowa County Fair Association**

At a meeting of the executive committee of the County Fair Association Thursday evening A. C. Miller was elected president and C. S. Bradley secretary, says the Enterprise News-Record.

Work was begun on the compilation of a premium list and an effort will be made to have the list completed, printed and in the hands of the public by not later than July 1.

It was decided to offer \$1500 in cash premiums and to ask the business men of the county to contribute the usual special premiums for the encouragement of such special exhibits as may appeal to them.

Grounds sufficiently large to include a half mile race track are available in the Bank addition at a distance not to exceed four blocks from the center of the city. These it is the intention to improve in a manner to enable the association to hold a strictly modern and up-to-date exposition of the resources of the county.

The executive committee as at present constituted is composed of seven members, all from Enterprise. It is the purpose of the association to make the fair strictly a county fair, representative of every part of the county. To that end it has been decided to increase the executive committee to a total of fifteen, the other eight members or a majority of the whole, to be representative men from other parts of the county, and all of them to be from other precincts than Enterprise.

A full representation of the committee was sent out Thursday evening, much enthusiasm was shown, and it was unanimously decided that every effort should be made to make this the most complete county fair ever held in Eastern Oregon.
