Wallawa Term to be Resumed next Tuesday with Grand Jury Session.

An official call was sent out this morning by Circuit Judge Knowles, naming July 25, as the date for resuming the adjourned term of circuit court. At that time several important cases held over from the last term, in addition to the alleged bootlegging cases, will come up for trial and it is expected that the session will last for some time.

The Union county grand jury will not likely be called for that term.

The Wallawa adjourned term opens next Tuesday and the grand jury will be recalled there to consider new cases.

To Whom It May Concern:

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 8th day of June, 1910, creating Improvement District No. 1, 2 and 3, and designating Willow Street from alley between Adams Avenue and Jefferson Avenue to the alley between Adams Avenue and Washington Avenue; the alley between Washington and Adams Avenue from "K" Street to Fourth Street; "N" Avenue from alley between Adams Avenue and Washington Avenue to Fourth Street; "O" Avenue from the alley between Adams Avenue and Washington Avenue to First Street; Pennsylvania Avenue from the alley between Adams Avenue and Washington Avenue to First Street; Third Street from Main Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue; Fourth Street from Adams Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue; alley between Fifth and Sixth Streets from Washington Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue; the alley between Sixth Street and Seventh Street from Washington Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue; the alley between Seventh Street and Eighth Street from

Washington Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue; the alley in Block 104, from Fourth Street to Washington Avenue on alley between Fifth and Sixth Streets, as District No. 3, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 8th day of June, 1910, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of said District No. 3, as herein after described by constructing sewers therein, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement or said district to be so improved are as follows: Willow Street from the alley between Adams Avenue and Jefferson Avenue to the alley between Adams Avenue and Washington Avenue the alley between Washington Avenue and Adams Avenue from "K" Street to Fourth Street. "N" Avenue from last mentioned alley to Fourth Street, "O" Avenue from said alley to First Street, "Penn" Avenue from said alley to First Street, Third Street from Main Avenue to "Penn" Avenue, Fourth Street from Adams Avenue to "Penn" Avenue, the alley between Fifth and Sixth Streets from Washington Avenue to "Penn" Avenue, the alley between Sixth and Seventh Streets, from Washington Avenue to "Penn" Avenue, the alley between Seventh Street and Eighth Street, from Washington Avenue to "Penn" Avenue, the alley in Block 104, Chaplin's Addition from Fourth Street to Washington Avenue and the alley between Fifth and Sixth Streets. Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$74,346.05. That the Council will on the 13th day

of July, 1910, meet at the Council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock, P. M., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
