To Whom It May Concern:

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating Improvement District No. 1, and designating Adams Avenue, or street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 15th day of September, 1909, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Adams Avenue, or Street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon macadam, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the

owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that the above described improvement be made: that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of Adams Avenue, from the east side of Fourth street, to the west side of Alder street. Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$12,000. That the Council will, on the 20th day of July, 1910, meet at the Council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock, p. m. to consider the estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of Feb., 1910, creating Improvement District No. 16 and designating Sixth Street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 17th day of June, 1910, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Sixth Street in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon Bitulithic pavement, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made, that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of Sixth Street, from the North line of Washington Avenue, to the North line of "K" Avenue.

#### Ordinance No. 463, Series 1910.

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to enter into a contract with C. T. Darley, for building cement sidewalks and curb on Pennsylvania Avenue and 4th street.

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.—That the Mayor and Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon, be, and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter a contract with C. T. Darley, for building cement sidewalk and cement curb on and along Pennsylvania Avenue and Fourth street, in front of the property of the City, and the intersection of said avenue and street, for a sum not to exceed the amount bid by said Darley.

Section 2.—This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer and after its approval by the Mayor, shall take effect on and from the 9th day of August, 1910.

Passed by the Council on the 6th day of July, 1910 by five members voting therefor.
