### Ready to Harvest Wheat.

Within a very few days the hum of the combine harvester will be heard in all parts of the county and the gigantic task of harvesting Umatilla's five million bushel crop of wheat and 40,000 bushel crop of barley will be in full swing. Some machines were started early last week in the Elliot Rock and west end sections and every day since then has seen one or more of the big harvesters started up. Sam Bittner started a machine in his barley fields on the reservation ranch which he is farming near Cayuse, yesterday morning, while in the Holdman country, two machines were started this morning. One is cutting for Watson and one for Gentry on the James Grubb ranch. Reports say that they are harvesting 30 bushels per acre on land that seldom produces better than 20 or 25 bushels.

Reports from every section of the country indicate that the yield is not only good but that the quality of the grain is as good or better than was ever produced before. In most sections it is free of weeds and smut while everything threshed so far is testing No. 1 with plenty of weight to spare.—Pendleton East Oregonian
