Washington, July 14. - Mayor Frank Del Carrington, U. S. A., today was given notice of his retirement by the war department. This closes one of the most remarkable cases on army records. In 1903 Garrington served as captain in the Philippines. He was accused of misappropriating funds. He was presumed guilty until proven innocent. Carrington was convicted, and sentenced to prison. He appealed to the United States supreme court which presumed him innocent until proved guilty. This reversed the lower court. On retrial Carrington was found innocent .-
