\$40,000 COME TO UNION

LAST THREE MONTHS HAVE SEEN LARGE INVESTMENTS.

Portland and Seattle People Spend Large Sums for Local Orchards

Forty thousand dollars of Portland and Seattle money have been expended in Union county during the past three months, according to authoritative statistics, and this amount is only what has been handled through one real estate firm. Perhaps again as much as this has come to Union county through the medium of other real estate dealers and from sources where there are no intermediate man. A liberal portion of the sum named came from Seattle where the investors were turned to Grande Ronde through the medium of a photograph of existing orchards. Deeming the picture so good that it warranted further investigation, the investor followed up the clue until he had purchased a large tract of land near Imbler.

The \$40,000 named were spent at Imbler and Cove, buying fruit tracts, indicating that while La Grande and other Grande Ronde valley towns are sending some money into Seattle and Portland real estate circles, there is a vastly larger amount coming this way.

Earlier in the season sales to Portland and Seattle people were brisk but not more so than they have been the past two or three months.

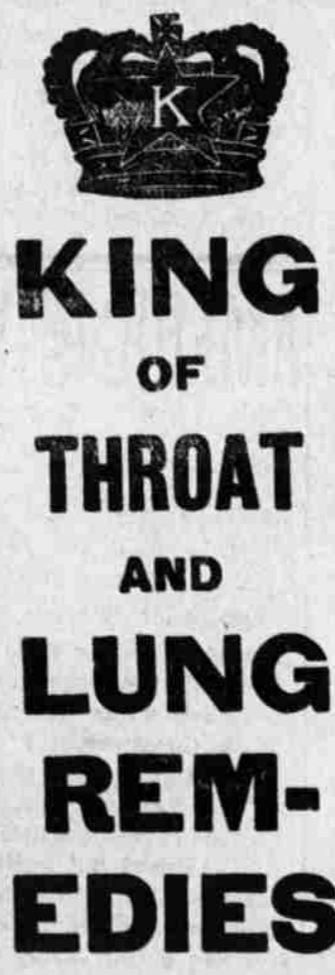
