THOMSON WILL BE PUT ON THE CARPET

FORMER LA GRANDE RECEIVER UNDER FEDERAL ORDERS

Must Explain Status of His Financial Condition to Court

Asa B. Thomson, Umatilla sheepman, land owner and rancher, and former receiver of the La Grande land office, has been cited to appear in federal court Wednesday, August 3, to tell how much and what property he owns that would satisfy a judgment of \$9821.86 given against him by the federal court.

The action is the outcome of a suit brought by Walter Niedner, receiver of the Farmers and Traders National bank of La Grande, which suit grew out of the conduct of the bank by J. W. Scriber, recently convicted in the federal court.

Today George R. Biddle filed an affidavit in the United States court setting out as his belief that Thomson had sufficient property subject to execution to pay the judgment. Based on this the attorneys for Niedner asked the court to order Thomson to appear in court and answer on oath concerning the amount of property he had, or in which he had a lien.

Maxwell

Thrills followed thrills as speeding course of the Ingleside Race Course, on the final day events of the successful meet at the Islam Temple of the Mystic Shrine.

The honors of the day were divided between the 200 horsepower Benz machine, and the 30 horsepower stock car. Oldfield lowered the five mile record from 5:15.6, which is a new coast record. With the exception of this performance, Oldfield placed in the list of racing honors, as the world's fastest driver, in both the five and fifteen mile handicap events. King and his Maxwell were the victors. In fact, the surprise of the meet, driving all of his races with Maxwell, taking the turns with his car as close to the fence as possible, the five mile handicap, Oldfield drove his Knox racer to the front, but the handicap was too strong and he could not get the lead from King. Not only in the handicap events did King and his Maxwell prove stars of the first order, but in one of the first events of the day, the five mile race for cars costing from \$1200 to \$1600, which was one of the best matches of the meet.

The time for the five mile handicap was as follows: Maxwell, King, 4:40.30; Oakland, Nelson, 4:48.25; Chalmers, West, 4:49.30; Auto Car, finished fourth, and the Knox car, Barney Oldfield driving, fifth.

In the event number eight, ten miles free-for-all handicap, King and his Maxwell again were the winners, the Maxwell's time being 19:30.
