LAND OWNERS INTERESTED CAN LEARN BOUNDARY

Petition will be Acted Upon by County Court September 7.

Full description of the proposed boundaries of the La Grande Irrigation district, are published today in the Observer and will be given the required publication between date and the 7th of September when the county court will take action on the matter. The boundaries are merely tentative and may be changed at will by the county court on request of the land owners in the district. The petition is in compliance with the statute, and is to notify the property owners in and around the district that they are to be given an opportunity to express themselves before the county court at the stipulated time. The tentative boundaries should be read with care, that people living in or near the district will be versed on the exact boundary lines.
