State Fair Season.

Chicago, Aug. 19.—With the opening of the Iowa State Fair at Des Moines next week, the state exhibition season will be on in full blast in the central West and Southwest. With prosperity generally prevailing throughout the agricultural regions, these annual displays promise to be actually, as well as in the small bills, "bigger and better than ever before." September will be a busy month for those who follow the big fair circuit. Following the Iowa show, which closes September 2, comes the Minne-

sota fair at Hamline, the Ohio fair at Columbus, and the Nebraska exhibition at Lincoln. All of these open September 5. The following week comes the Wisconsin, Indiana and Kansas state fairs, running from September 12 to 16. The Michigan state fair at Detroit is scheduled to open on September 19; the Oklahoma fair at Oklahoma City on September 27; the Illinois state fair at Springfield on September 30. The first day of October witnesses the opening of the Missouri state fair at Sedalia, and on October 15, the Texas state fair begins at Dallas.
