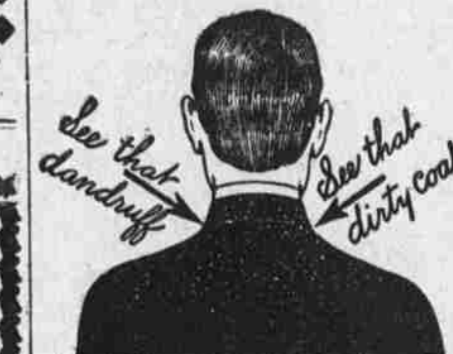
Wm. Banton is having extensive improvements made on his house by the addition of new windows, a new room and porch.
