

RHODES PRIZE TO BE AWARDED

Examination Will Be Held at Eugene for Free Oxford Scholarship.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Or., Sept. 8.—The examinations for the Rhodes Scholarship will be held at the University of Oregon October 25 and 26. As far as known there are only five students in the state who will try for this prize—one candidate from McMinnville college, one from Pacific University and three from the University of Oregon. None of the other colleges are represented.

The Rhodes scholarships, granted in the will of the late Cecil Rhodes, amounting to 300 pounds to be used in a scholarship at the University of Oxford and are tenable for three years. The candidate for this scholarship must be an American-born citizen and unmarried; he must be between the ages of 19 and 25 and must have passed his sophomore year at some degree giving university or college. The examinations cover Greek and Latin grammar and mathematics. The Greek may be omitted but it must be made up if the scholarship is granted.

ed. Mathematics covers the whole of arithmetic, and either the elements of algebra or the elements of geometry.

Among the rules for the judges' selection of a candidate are the following: "The student shall be judged in regard to (1) his literary and scholastic attainments; (2) his fondness for and success in manly out-door sports, such as football and the like; (3) his qualities of manhood, truth, courage, devotion to study, sympathy and protection for the weak, kindness, unselfishness and fellowship; and (4) his exhibition during school days of moral force of character, and of instincts to lead and take interest in his school-mates."
