THINKS RATES RIGHT.

Commissioner Prouty Can See Fault With Inland Town Rates.

Spokane, Wash., Sept. 15—Special—Charles Prouty, a member of the Interstate Commerce Commission, who presided at four sessions here, September 13 and 14, to correct inconsistencies, inaccuracies and omissions. If any, in the schedule of rates made recently by that body in the Spokane case, said in an interview here:

"I think the traffic rates that apply to Spokane and the Pacific Coast are about right. Both the coast merchants and the Spokane dealers are complaining. If only one side had grievances, there might be some cause for complaint, but as both are fighting, it seems as though the present schedule is about right."

The main fight of the Spokane merchants is to have the rate on carload lots and less than carloads made more equitable. They do not care much whether the commission lowers the carload rate or raises the price for smaller consignment.

The coast merchants ask that the rate from Portland, Tacoma and Seattle to Spokane be lowered, claiming that the low rate east to Spokane gives the eastern manufacturers a chance to put their goods in here cheaper than the coast people can.

Though the various railroad companies were represented, not a witness was called by them the first day. The testimony will probably come up before the commission for decision early in November.
