### ABRAHAM WILL SPEAK HERE

ADDRESS IS SCHEDULED FOR THIS EVENING.

Taft-Hughes-Roosevelt Plan of Primaries Will be Discussed.

Senator Albert Abraham, candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor, will speak in La Grande tonight in the course of his campaign through Eastern Oregon. Senator Abraham will speak on the political issues of the day especially touching on the "Hughes-Taft-Roosevelt plan." Senator Abraham is making his campaign on the "Hughes-Taft-Roosevelt plan,"—the plan being an amendment to the present Primary Law. By this plan, the voters at the Primaries elect certain committees, the members of which go on the ballot by petition only. These committees have the power to "designate" candidates for office. Candidates so "designated" are not required to circulate petitions. But any candidate may still go on the ballot by petition, as at present. At his meeting Senator Abraham will explain in detail the Hughes plan. He will also discuss the other issues of the campaign. Senator Abraham has severely criticized the condition of the various county jails and has announced that

whether he is elected or not he will advocate very necessary reforms. He declares them to be a relic of medieval times and a menace to the health of those compelled to occupy them and to the morals of the community that tolerates them.

Senator Abraham opened his gubernatorial campaign three weeks ago at Eugene. Since then he has been at the Astoria Regatta, where he was an officer on the staff of Admiral W. W. Robinson. He spoke at Astoria Saturday night. Following his tour in eastern Oregon, Senator Abraham will speak in the Willamette valley and in Southern Oregon, concluding his tour in Roseburg, the eve of the Primaries.
