ORDINANCE NO. 472, SERIES 1910.

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder be, and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Burroughs Adding Machine Company, for the purchase by the City of an adding machine, at a price not to exceed the sum of \$375.00.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer and after its approval by the Mayor, shall be in force and take effect from and after the 17th day of October, 1910.

ORDINANCE NO. 473, SERIES 1910.

An Ordinance declaring the cost of improving Fourth street, in front of Lots 5, 6, and the north 25 feet of Lot 7, in Block 97, Chaplin's Addition to La Grande, Oregon, and assessing the property benefitted thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of City Liens.

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Fourth street in front of Lots 5, 6, and the north 25 feet of Lot 7 in Block 97, in Chaplin's addition, and all objections thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in the manner provided by resolution adopted by the Council on the 27th day of April, 1910, to be the sum of \$112.04 and that the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot, or part thereof within the said assessment district No. 9 by reason of such improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts set opposite the number of each lot or part thereof in the annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered two, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the Recorder of the City of La Grande is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of City Liens, and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by charter. That the sums herein assessed against the property described in the annexed assessment roll may be paid in five annual installments, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum the first installment being payable within sixty days from the passage of this ordinance.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be published in the La Grande Evening Observer for one issue thereof, and after its approval by the Mayor shall be in force and take effect on and after the 17th day of October, 1910.

being constructed by B. S. Davis, to provide for the compensation to be paid said Jones for said work, and to fix the amount of bond to be furnished by him for the faithful performance of said work.

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder be, and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with W. L. Jones to superintend and inspect the building of the sewers now being constructed by B. S. Davis, at the stipulated price of \$5.00 per day. Provided, that said Inspector shall furnish a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$2000.00 to be approved by the Mayor, conditioned for the faithful performance by him of the said work.

Section 2. Inasmuch as it is necessary and expedient that said Inspector proceed with his said work immediately, and that this Ordinance take effect at once, now, therefore, in order to preserve the peace, health and safety of the City this Ordinance shall, after its approval by the Mayor and its publication for one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer be in force and take effect from and after the 17th day of September, 1910.
