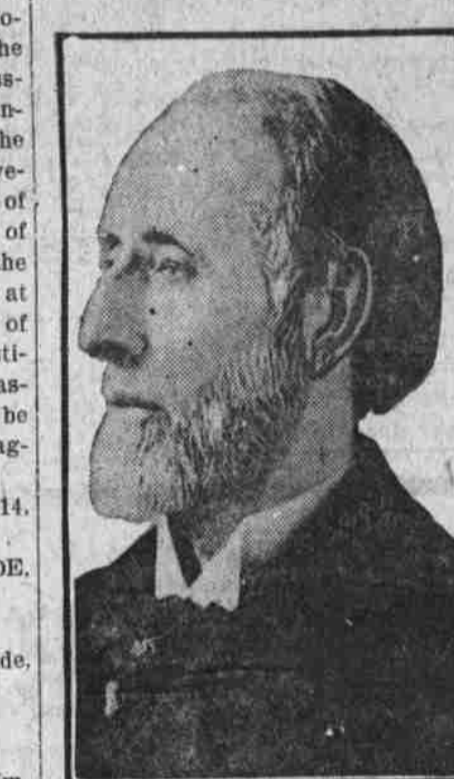

 Missouri Congressman, Who Favors Old Age Pensions.



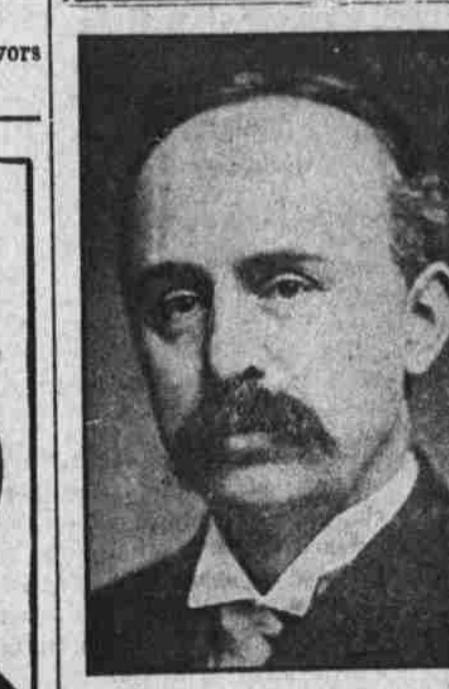
