\$65,000 City of La Grande, Oregon Improvement Bonds

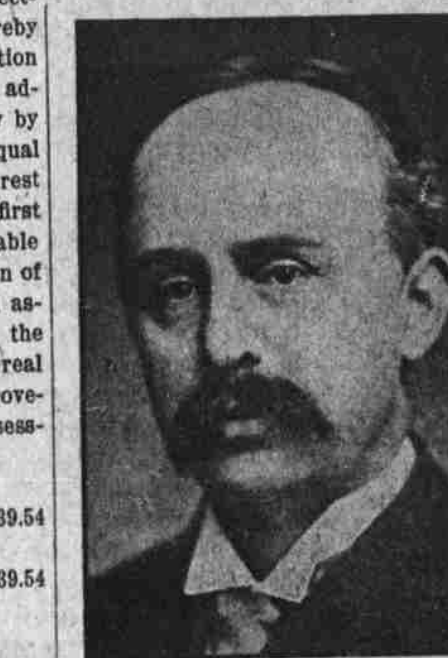
Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals will be received by the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, until Wednesday.
