THE REED STATUE.

Memorial Erected in Portland to Former Speaker of House.
A national figure of a few years ago and one whose reputation was not confined to his own country was honored in his home city, Portland, Me., recently when a bronze statue of the late Thomas B. Reed, for many years speaker of the house of representatives, was unveiled. The memorial stands on the western promenade over-

looking Casco bay, is eight feet high and represents Reed in an attitude of repose, with a scroll in the left hand. The pedestal is of Maine granite, nine feet high. The memorial was modeled in Paris by Burr C. Miller, who not only worked from accurate photographs, but who had the advantage of having seen Mr. Reed many times during his congressional career and who met him frequently after his retirement from public life. It gives a fine idea of the statesman as he looked up to about two years before his death. The cost was about \$40,000.
