ST. MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS' DAY

LOCAL EPISCOPAL CHURCH WILL
CELEBRATE EVENT.

Oregon Churchman Defines Importance of Religious Day.

Tomorrow being the Festival of St. Michael and All Angels, there will be a celebration of the Holy Eucharist in St. Peter's church at 10 a. m.

It is well that we should have one day appointed on which to contemplate the wonderful order of Angels. These strong and glorious beings, the hosts of Heaven, are immortal. We are quite clear as to their reality and work. They were seen by Abraham, Jacob, Moses, Job, Hagar, David, Daniel, Gideon, Isaiah, Ezekiel, Zacharias, St. Peter, St. John the Divine, and many others. There are nine orders of Angels:

The burning Seraphim, who excel in love.

The intellectual Cherubim, who excel in knowledge.

The strong and stable Thrones, who, in their calmness are used by God to reveal His judgments.

Dominions, who are above the rest to guide them.

Principalities, those who rule in majesty.

Powers, those who receive power to carry out true government.

Virtues, those by whom signs and wonders are worked.

Archangels, chief messengers from God to men.

Angels, the messengers.

Of Archangels, the chief is Michael, whose name means "who is like God"; he is the Angel of the Church Militant. We also read of St. Gabriel, the Angel of the Annunciation; of Raphael, the guide of strangers; of Uriel, the Angel of Light. Every person has his or her guardian angel and from the angels we learn order, obedience, promptitude. We should try and look upon our guardian angel as a friend who is always with us, interested in our safety and ready to help us in our fight against sin.

St. Michael is spoken of in the sacred Scriptures as an Angel of great power and dignity (Dan. 10:13; 12:1) and as triumphing over the evil one (Rev. 12:7). In Christian art he is represented with a spear in one hand and a cross on his forehead, sometimes with a flaming sword to withstand the assaults of the evil powers, but often with only a cross in hand, as if that were enough to put down evil. In reply to the question: "What are Angels?" Bishop Hooker said: "They are spirits immaterial and intellectual, they are many in number and obey God perfectly. Desire to resemble Him in goodness maketh them unwearied and even unsatiable in their longing to do, by all means, all manner of good unto all the creatures of God, but especially unto men."

Mark Twain in Parliament

After a visit to England once Mark Twain said on his return to New York: "Among other honors heaped upon me by Englishmen was that of being photographed in parliament. I am not a member of parliament. But neither am I a member of congress. Has any fellow American suggested that I should be photographed in congress? No. I blush to say that they have not. And yet here is an honor that might without risk be bestowed on any great man. And yet it was not bestowed upon Washington, Jefferson or Lincoln. When I saw that photograph, with the mother of parliaments in the background, and realized my advancing years I said to myself, 'Here are two noble monuments of antiquity—two shining examples of the survival of the fittest!'"

Tommy Burns Now a Promoter.

Nyah Brusso (Tommy Burns), the former Canadian lacrosse player and heavyweight champion pugilist of the world, who has organized an Indian lacrosse team for a trip to Australia, has engaged as manager and coach for the outfit Jimmy Murphy of the Torontos. Tommy figures that his popularity, with the added attraction of a team of Canadian Indians, would mean heavy business in the antipodes, and the trip will be made during the coming winter.

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
